Open Your Home and Heart to an FIV+ Cat

Kitties with FIV are often misunderstood, and some people falsely believe they can catch FIV from these sweet felines. People and other animals cannot get FIV. FIV can be passed to another cat through a deep bite wound, so FIV+ and FIV- cats that get along can easily live together. FIV cats have weakened immune systems, so they are more at risk of having side effects from common diseases, wounds or infections. This makes routine medical care essential for these cats. We hope that one day there will be no more stigma around this very manageable disease.

There are actually two FIV cats' rooms in the shelter: one in the front placement area and one in the back. The back FIV cats' room even has an attached outdoor enclosure so those kitties can go outside safely when they want to get some fresh air. Come in and visit these special cats. One of them might just steal your heart.

Peanut is a timid young cat who raised four healthy, loving kittens and is now seeking an opportunity to blossom into someone's spoiled forever kitty. Peanut needs to feel safe to explore indoor life in a cozy home with a food bowl that is full, toys to play



Cat Welfare: 2023 CALENDAR, PHOTO CONTEST

Would your kitty like to be famous? Well, actually would YOU like your kitty to be famous? Cat Welfare invites you to submit your best photo(s) of your favorite kitties. If your photo is chosen, it will be published in the CWA 2023 Calendar, which will be on sale next fall before November 1st.

CONTEST RULES:

• Be sure your photo is focused and of good quality. If your picture is blurry, then it is not likely to be selected for the calendar. The larger the JPG file size, the better the quality.



- The contest is open to everyone. You can submit as many entries as you want, provided you pay the \$10 entry fee for each photo. Photos may be taken from any place or time, but the subject must be a cat. Other animals may be in the photo. Sorry, no humans allowed in the photo.
- You must own the rights to the photo. Photos that have appeared in CWA's *Feline Forum* Newsletter or in previous calendars are eligible, provided they have not been published elsewhere.
- Voting will be performed on-line at: http://www.catwelfareassoc.org/ beginning in March. You, your friends, and family may vote as many times as you like for each photo. You must purchase a minimum of 5 votes for a \$5 donation to support CWA. Forward your pet's CWA photo page to your friends and family and then ask them to donate to vote for your pet!
- A panel of judges selected by the Cat Welfare Association will determine 10 winning photos from the top 20 photos with the most votes, as well as 3 photos chosen from all entries. The CWA judges' decisions are final. Winners will be announced online at catwelfareassoc.org on August 15.
- To enter the contest, starting in March, follow the steps at http://www.catwelfareassoc.org/ by uploading your JPG format photo and vote for your favorite entries. You may also enter by mailing in this form. Entry form(s) must be postmarked and electronic entries must be submitted before June 30, 2022. Voting for the contest ends at midnight EST on July 31, 2022. Be sure to include a 150 word story or description all about your cat's rescue, adoption or favorite things to do, along with each photo.
