## Do You Have Room in Your Heart for a Senior Cat?

Cat Welfare staff member Megan is known for her love of senior cats. She adopted her first senior cat, Russell, in 2014. Not long after came Hugo, who brightened her life for 10 months. She currently has four senior kitties and encourages other people to consider adopting a senior cat of their own. Why? Senior cats are often overlooked in shelters, but they know common cat courtesy and don't need to be trained. They often have a laid-back nature that comes only with age, so you can learn a lot from them. Lastly, they express their gratitude with constant love and affection that makes every day better.

Stop by Cat Welfare to meet some of our sweet older residents, including the two below. Cats ages 11 and older are considered "senior" and can be adopted for just \$25. This fee includes vaccinations, deworming, testing for feline leukemia and FIV, spaying or neutering and microchipping.





Mesut is about 13 years old. He was in a loving home since 2014 and was recently returned to the shelter due to the arrival of a baby. The couple did everything they could to help Mesut adjust to their new family member, but they made the decision to give him an opportunity for a new family when he began to self mutilate by pulling out fur. Mesut has been a-okay here at the shelter and is not

pulling out his fur.

Ideally, he would be your one and only cat, but he does just fine with other gentle cats. He does feel strongly about not allowing another dominant cat to share his space.

If you are looking for a purrfect senior cat, please come in and meet Mesut! Scoop him up and give him a hug. We bet he'll steal your heart.



Lady Gray is a sweet senior cat who has suffered the loss of not one but two owners. At 11 years old, this gentle-natured cat is seeking a quiet home where she can be someone's attentive companion. Lady Gray is defensive around other cats, and we want to place her in a home where she can be the only pet. Could you provide her with the home she is seeking?
