She had recently arrived at the shelter after being rescued from a sewer drain, and she was quickly gaining weight while awaiting her forever home. Not long after, Mr. Sugar also arrived in the shelter, and it was determined that both kitties have eosinophilic granuloma, an inflammatory skin disorder. The pair was lucky enough to be adopted together, and under their new mama's diligent care, they're doing very well.


