
Registration Open for 2023 Cat Caper 5K

Diabetic Cats are Sweet, If You Do Your Homework

I adopted *Ellie* back in January 2022, knowing she had diabetes and was a senior cat. Caring for a cat with diabetes was challenging at first, but it gradually became easier. My biggest concern was that Ellie would resent me for constantly poking her and taking her to the vet. However, she is such a sweetheart that while she may be a little grumpy at first, her forgiving nature always shines through. To enhance my knowledge and support, I joined a Facebook group called "Feline Diabetes Support Group." Without this group, I wouldn't have gained all the knowledge I have now.

Initially, Ellie required two insulin shots per day. I later switched her to Fancy Feast paté, which is lower in carbs. Recently, I had the vet apply a Libre monitor, which helps track her blood sugar levels. Slowly but surely, she might be going into remission, and I couldn't be happier for her. Ellie is the sweetest cat, snuggling up to me at

every opportunity. She sleeps in the crook of my arm every night and climbs on my lap when I'm watching TV. I love her dearly and hope she has many more healthy years ahead.

Caring for a cat with diabetes can be challenging but also rewarding. My advice is to conduct thorough research, perform regular at-home testing with a meter and keep track of their glucose levels. While not every cat goes into remission, it is possible.

Additionally, I wanted to mention that taking care of a diabetic cat is not as expensive as you might think. I found coupons that allowed me to purchase five insulin pens of Lantus for \$35. The Libre monitor cost me around \$40 with a coupon. There are also resources like GoodRx and other discounts available, so it doesn't have to strain your budget.

With your love and care, I will thrive, illuminating your life with this little light of mine.



Mr. Magoo is a gentle-natured senior cat who spent years of comfort in his owner's home. Sadly, his owner could no longer care for him or his companion cat, Molly, so they were returned to our shelter. Mr. Magoo is a diabetic kitty, and he is currently doing well with twice daily

insulin injections. Daily injections are not difficult to give and especially simple on a cat like Magoo.

Mr. Magoo is so very appreciative of attention, but as a gentle, quiet cat, he can get overlooked. Can we teach you how to care for this special senior? Wanted: Foster Teammates

Our adoption success would not happen without the dedication of our spectacular foster team! Won't you

please consider becoming a member?

Kittens, once approved for shelter intake, go into foster care if they are not old enough to be spayed or neutered when they arrive. Some litters have a mom, who accompanies them in foster care, while others arrive motherless.



Foster care commitments can range from one week to a couple of months. We do ask that you have a room in your home where the foster(s) can live without interacting with any of your pets until they are fully vaccinated and have been approved for interaction by our shelter veterinarian. This important requirement is not only for the sake of the foster but for your fur babies, too. We will provide you with food, litter, a litter box and any required medications for the fosters. Our foster care commitment and application form can be found online at <u>catwelfareassoc.org/volunteer</u>.

From January through June 2023, we adopted **354 cats** into loving homes.
