Decisions and Reports

- 1. The consent agenda was approved.
- 2. Executive Director Helen DeSantis provided the Shelter Report:
 - a. 54 cats were adopted in June, 354 YTD
 - b. We're in the midst of kitten season 14 in shelter 30 in foster care.
 - c. We have a new vet, All Critters in Grove City, to help with spaying/neutering.
 - d. Research at shelter Gail
 - 1. Zoey, a researcher from Ohio State University studied the fecal matter in the shelter litter boxes to determine the presence of bacteria and parasites.
 - 2. Results from the study found no salmonella, campylobacter, or carbapenem resistant bacteria.

- 3. From the parasitology portion of the testing, one case of Giardia was found in a cat that was already being treated for this condition.
- 4. Zoie commended the staff on the intake protocol as well as daily cleaning maintenance.
- e. 2023 Cat Caper planning is in progress.
 - 1. 41 participants so far
- f. Nomad clinic dates have been scheduled on July 26 and September 20
