You know we care for a lot of cats, but did you know that, on average, we use 600 pounds of litter daily? In November 2021, we were leveled with the news that Nestlé would no longer be producing Scamp brand litter. That meant we were facing an unexpected additional expense to the tune of \$9,000 for 2022. While a frazzled human took to the Internet to research our best litter options, Emmy took to the drawing board and created Emmy's Litter League.

Volunteers Needed for CWA Foster Team

Our adoption success would not happen without the dedication of our spectacular foster team! Won't you please consider becoming a member?

Kittens, once approved for shelter intake, go into foster care if they are not old enough to be spayed or neutered when they arrive. Some litters have a mom, who accompanies them in foster care, while others arrive motherless.

Foster care commitments can range from one week to a couple of months. We do ask that you have a room in your home where the foster(s) can live without interacting with any of your pets until they are fully vaccinated and have been approved for interaction by our shelter veterinarian. This important requirement is not only for the sake of the foster but for your fur babies, too. We will provide you with food, litter, a litter box and any required medications for the fosters. It was a transitional year for Cat Welfare as we adjusted to the challenges posed by the pandemic. We are excited about the positive outcomes that would not have been possible without the outpouring of love, encouragement and support from our members and friends. Kudos to the amazing staff, volunteers, and the Board of Directors for this extraordinary team effort.

IN KEEPING WITH OUR MISSION AND PURPOSE

- **876** cats and kittens were admitted to the shelter, many with life-threatening injuries.
- 270 felines were cared for daily (on average).
- 768 cats and kittens were adopted into loving homes.
- **3,108** altering surgeries were subsidized through Cat Welfare's low-cost spay and neuter programs.
- **41,000** telephone calls from community members received a response after they reached out for assistance.
