## Shelter Closed for Maintenance Project

The deferred maintenance project to refurbish the interior of the shelter is underway. We are so excited about these improvements, which will make the environment healthier for our cats and kittens!

Although the shelter is temporarily closed weekdays and evenings, limited intake and adoption services are being provided. Pregnant, injured stray cats and returned cats adopted from Cat Welfare are accepted by appointment. When possible, the shelter will be open for adoptions on weekends from 11 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

We expect to reopen with full services on or about November 4.
